Commissioners Corner

For the past three years, our area has experienced record rainfalls during the month of May, with the last one breaking the record for accumulated rain since 1870. That being said, preventing our roads and roadways from flooding has been challenging at best. Although, some of our lowest lying areas were hit the hardest, for the most part, once the rain stopped all our roads and ditches were free of standing water. This is due in part to all the improvements we have made with drainage issues that we have addressed over the past few years.

The snow season, even though we didn't have record setting snowfall, we experienced many smaller totals and timing where it required the crew to repeat the routes to ensure that our roads were ice free and used over 100 tons of salt to accomplish that.

During the COVID 19 shutdown time our crews took precautions and continued with the maintenance that roads and roadways required. In addition, we formulated our resurfacing plans for this season with our engineers and distributed the specifications out to bid. So far this has resulted in a joint effort with the township administration in the resurfacing of the Kedzie Avenue facility. We are currently in the bid letting process for a number of roads to be resurfaced this season.

Assessor's Office

Assessor Jones wants to remind all residents that the Appeals Process for Bremen Township will begin on August 6th and will end on September 10. Due to the uncertainty of the pandemic situation, the Assessor's Office strongly recommends that residents contact the office to schedule an appointment with the staff to ensure that you get the assistance you may need for filing an appeal.

During the shutdown, the staff worked remotely and continued processing exemptions, and kept in contact via online or by phone with Cook County personnel and township residents to resolve property tax issues.

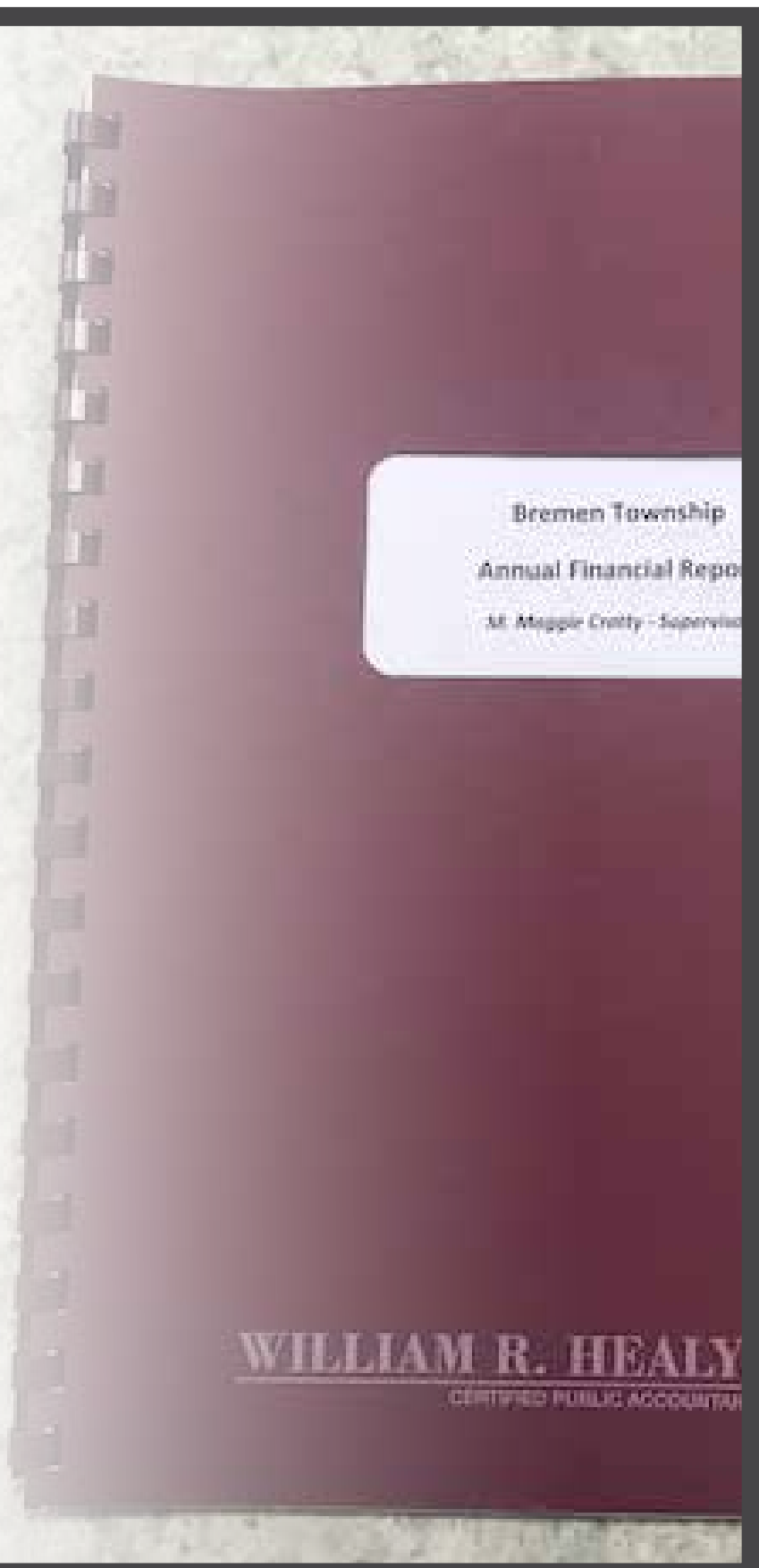
High Marks for Bremen Township Audit



Bremen Township is pleased to announce the findings of its most recent Financial Audit. The audit found that Bremen Township is on firm financial ground, debt free, along with cash balances in every department.

Independent financial professionals have declared that the financial policies that the township officials has established and implemented have earned a triple AAA rating from Moodys along with the highest rating of AAAm from Standard and Poor's rating services. A fund rated "AAAm" demonstrates extremely strong capacity to maintain principal stability. AAAm is the highest principal fund rating assigned by S&P Global ratings. This is no small feat considering that Bremen Township is one of the lowest taxing bodies in the State of Illinois.

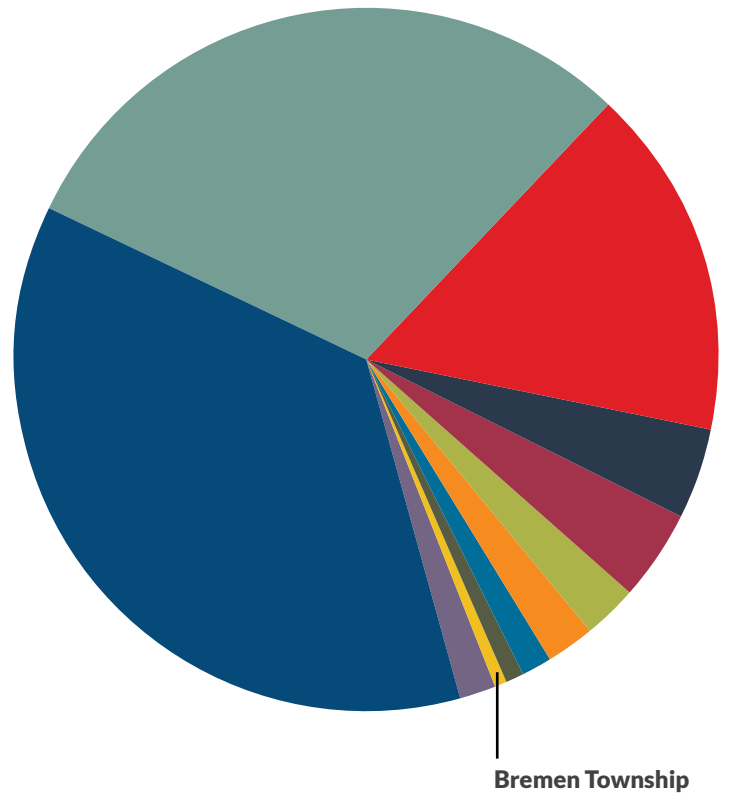
Supervisor Crotty extends her thanks and appreciation to the Board of Trustees along with all the departments for their commitment to making fiscal responsibility a priority.



Property Tax Distribution

A typical Bremen Township resident pays approximately \$7,500.00 per year in property taxes to multiple taxing bodies. To help better understand where your tax dollars are spent, we have listed the average percentage of taxes paid to each entity.

This pie chart illustrates the average distribution of your tax dollars. This clearly shows that **for every 10 dollars of property taxes paid by homeowners, Bremen Township receives approximately only 10 cents**, and concludes along with reinforcing the fact that township government is one of our greatest values. In turn, Bremen Township provides a wide range of services that are available to each and every resident of the thirteen municipalities that comprise and are within our boundaries.

Value of Partnerships

- + Bremen Township values the partnerships that we have established with other government agencies and non-profit organizations to provide an array of services available to our residents. By combining forces, it allows us to enhance and expand the many services that residents depend on. Listed below are some of the partnerships we have formed and the benefits for the recipients.

Together We Cope/ Chicago Food Depository

This program distributes free fresh produce on the second Friday of each month to any individual or family in need at our Markham facility. So far this year we have served 8,008 individuals and 2,455 households with 142,829 pounds of farm fresh produce, dairy and other food items. This program relies on our army of volunteers for distribution and is provided at no cost to the taxpayers.

Age Options

This program provides healthy, nutritious daily lunches to seniors in our senior cafe at our Oak Forest facility for a recommended donation of four dollars. The cafe also serves as a meeting place for seniors to get together, play board games, or just visit one another and enjoy a cup of coffee at no charge. Even through the Covid 19 shut down we continued to serve meals with a takeout drive thru operation. In addition we also distributed non-perishable food packages with our Senior Wheels Program to senior residents who were homebound. Contact our Senior Services Department at (708)687-8220 for more details. This also is funded by Age Options, but not the taxpayers of Bremen Township.

NAMI

This partnership is one of the latest additions of services offered and available to the residents of Bremen Township. NAMI is the National Alliance of Mental Illness, which presents classes and seminars for families affected by mental illness and stress issues in the meeting rooms at our Oak Forest facility along with online presentations. The Covid 19 situation has had a devastating effect on so many people in all walks in life and NAMI is a free benefit to all who seek assistance during this ongoing crisis.
