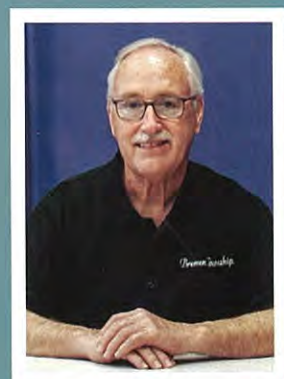

By far, our Senior Department has seen the largest increase of participation in its programs and services that are offered to seniors aged 55 or older.

This was accomplished by reaching out to the senior community in every city, town and village within our township through our recently developed and distribution of our Senior Newsletter (Senior Sentinel) and recognizing the interests and needs that are vital to them. Our Senior Wheels Program has seen significant growth due to the fact that some municipalities have discontinued their service. We now provide over 1,000 rides per month, transporting seniors to various destinations. Approximately 50% of these rides are medically related and not limited to township boundaries. These trips are essential and life saving to our clients who have no other form of transportation.

We have also increased activities and day trips with fun filled destinations and points of interest every month. Some of the new activities we have added include the Spring Fling Event which seniors bring their grandchildren and spend an afternoon of dancing, a photo booth, games and activities. A Holiday Craft Day has been a big hit where seniors have the opportunity to show their creative talents, along with our Plant N Go Day by planting flowers and herbs to take with them when they leave. As always, all supplies and light refreshments are provided by Bremen Township. In order to keep it affordable, our Day Trips are offered at cost.

Let us not forget our mainstays – BINGO and our lunch program. Bingo is held every Thursday at 9:30 for \$5.00 for 25 games with light refreshments being served. Our Lunch Program serves a great lunch in our Senior Café Monday thru Thursday for a requested donation of \$4.00 – a great way to spend the afternoon with your friends and neighbors.





## Greetings From Your Congressman

At my town hall meetings and community events, I've consistently heard from folks who are concerned about the cost of living and its effect on everyday life – be that at the gas pump, the grocery store, or the pharmacy. Like most issues, there is no quick fix and addressing it requires action on a variety of fronts. That's why I have centered my work on making life more affordable for our community.

Whether I'm at work in the district or in Washington, I have prioritized enhancing the local economy and revitalizing manufacturing jobs. I remained focused on returning money to taxpayers and minimizing costs whenever and wherever possible – such as reducing electricity prices, offering energy efficiency rebates, and curbing health care expenses by lowering premiums and capping prescription drugs such as insulin.

My work isn't done, and I will continue fighting to keep costs under control make sure every family has the opportunity to get ahead by:

**Putting Money Directly Back In Your Pocket** – My constituent advocate team has helped return over **\$6.6 million** directly back to constituents and resolved 8,840 cases.

**Lowering Monthly Internet Bills** – The Affordable Connectivity Program provides a discount on monthly internet bills for low and middle income households which includes over 20,000 households in our district. I strongly support H.R. 6929 which will extend this crucial funding.

**Curbing Costs at the Gas Pump** – I introduced the People over Petroleum Act which will deliver \$500.00 direct cash rebate paid directly to consumers by eliminating 11 tax subsidies flowing to fossil fuel companies.

# A FEW WORDS FROM OUR COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

## Monica Gordon



Representing the Cook County 5th District which serves the eastern portion of Bremen Township is Commissioner Monica Gordon who is laser focused in addressing issues that affect the hard working and the most vulnerable residents of the district.

**Invest in Cook Initiative** – Helped secure funding for close to **\$8 million** to be distributed across the Southland for roads, bicycle paths and creating safe routes for our children to get to school.

**Habitat for Humanity** – Along with volunteers, partners and donors broke ground for 20 homes making homeownership possible for families.

**Menopause Research and Funding** – Providing education and treatment for symptoms of pre-menopause, menopause and post-menopause guaranteeing proper care for women.

## Donna Miller



The Western portion of Bremen Township is represented by our friend and partner Cook County Commissioner Donna Miller. We have been fortunate to work with her on a variety of projects and services.

**Maternal Health Care** – This past May co-hosted a public hearing to gather expert data and strategies to combat the rise in maternal morbidity and mortality. As a result of this informative hearing, Commissioner Miller secured **\$1 million** to establish doula services in the Cook County Health System to curb these rates.

**Behavioral & Mental Health Care** – As a long time advocate for mental health issues Commissioner Miller took a huge role in the Cook County Health “Stronger Together” Grant Program and helped secure **\$44 million** being awarded to non- profits addressing behavioral health with approximately **\$14 million** going to the Southland of Cook County.

**Economic Development & Infrastructure** – This past summer alone Commissioner Miller secured over **\$3 million** to go to local communities in the South Suburb and worked closely with the Southland Development Authority to spur economic growth in the South Suburbs.

**Public Safety** – Secured over **\$500,000** in Urban Area Security Initiative funding for Public Safety and Homeland Security related projects throughout the district.

As always, we are confident and thankful to Commissioner Donna Miller in continuing to work with Bremen Township and other local leaders to serve as an advocate for the residents.

Greetings to all my friends and neighbors in Bremen Township. As a long term resident of the Village of Crestwood, the Bremen Township community is especially important to me, and helped propel me to get involved during the clean water crisis that we experienced in 2010 which threatened access to clean and safe water. And I took action to protect our most precious asset. Since joining the M.W.R.D. board, I have remained committed to protecting our water environment and storm water management projects and partnership programs.

I am grateful to partner with Bremen Township communities on projects such as the Robbins Heritage Park and Midlothian Creek Restoration Project. These flood control projects will remove 140 acres of land from the flood plains and provide the much needed relief for 92 homes and businesses. Other projects throughout Bremen Township have included improvements to Natalie Creek in Oak Forest and Midlothian and the construction of green alleys in Markham, along with the addition of permeable street pavers in Tinley Park.

I along with fellow M.W.R.D. Commissioner Yumeka Brown look forward to continuing our work with the township together and we hope to meet many more residents at the Bremen Township Women's Wellness event on October 19th.

We are proud to announce that we have joined forces with the Crisis Center for South Suburbia. This non-profit community organization focuses on prevention and provides essential services to individuals and families that are victimized by domestic violence.

They provide an array of services designed for victims that are experiencing abuse of any kind and gain their independence by providing a safe haven.

Their counseling services are free of charge and offers limited funds to move to self efficiency. Along with that they grant emergency housing which is open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. They also have traditional housing and resources and supportive services and gain life skills to assist victims for up to 24 months. They have a 24 hour hot line with professionally trained staff to intervene during a crisis and provide support and referrals to help them break free.

The **Safe Start Program** collaborates with local schools to educate young people about dating violence and encourage healthy relationships.

## AN INTERESTING FACT & A CHANCE TO BLOW OUR HORN



The State of Illinois is comprised of 1,432 townships. Recently, T.O.I. (Township Officials of Illinois) sponsored a contest that challenged to submit highlights and projects that are beneficial to its residents. Knowing that we would be facing stiff competition from larger and more affluent townships, we accepted the challenge. We entered this competition and submitted the construction of the Maggie Crotty Walking Path, which was previously a plot of our land that was overgrown and filled with debris and transformed into an area for all our residents to enjoy. Much to our delight, we received a 2nd Place finish – similar to a silver medal in the Olympics – not bad. We are proud that 90% of the construction was carried out by our very own staff.

## ***Our New Addition***



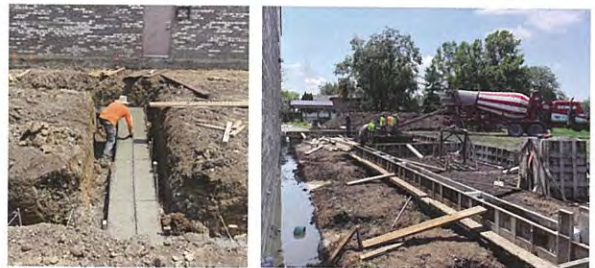
**We have finally broken ground for our multi-purpose sunroom addition adjacent to our Senior Café which will be connected to the Maggie Crotty Walking Path.**

## NAMI

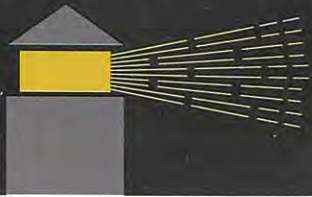

## HOMewood

*Tucked away in the far Southeast corner of Bremen Township is one of the jewels of the South Suburbs. This gem is the vibrant Village of Homewood.*



Homewood has not one, but three business districts in town, all of which have seen solid growth over the past year. Restaurants and businesses abound with mom and pop stores to national brands and big box establishments with everything in between and resident's wishes for additional choices continue to be met. At last count Homewood has 67 eating establishments – including my favorite, the old standby – White Castle – you will never go hungry in Homewood.

On the west side of town the former Brunswick Zone bowling alley has been transformed into retail use with many new establishments coming soon, including a new breakfast/lunch restaurant in the Cherry Creek Plaza.

Our eastern section is home to the Wind Creek Casino which will be open by mid-November. This is a venture shared with our neighbor East Hazel Crest, with a percentage of the gaming revenue will be divided amongst all of the 45 suburban communities. Adjacent to the casino, construction has begun on a new hotel and entertainment center, which has been slated to open in the spring of 2025.

Our downtown area is anchored by both a METRA and AMTRAK station and is home to over a dozen quaint, attractive small boutique type businesses. Additionally, it hosts numerous restaurants with a variety of offerings to please your palates.

We have had positive and productive discussions with several developers who are interested in building more Transit – Orientated Developments (TOD) close to the METRA station and we anticipate ground-breaking next year which will add even more eateries to choose from.

Homewood's economic development successes are due to the hard working staff and great Village Board that understands how to get things done. If you haven't frequented our shopping and dining scene lately, I encourage you to do so. Come on in to town, visit our shopping areas and try out our many restaurant choices.
