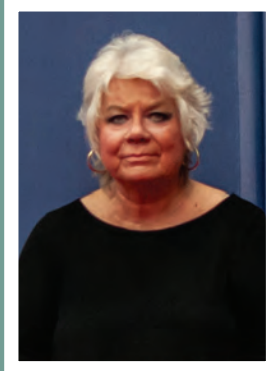

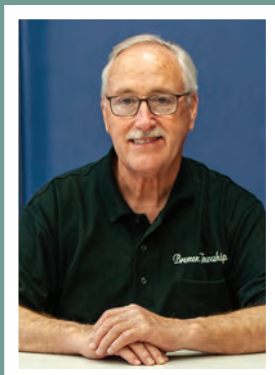

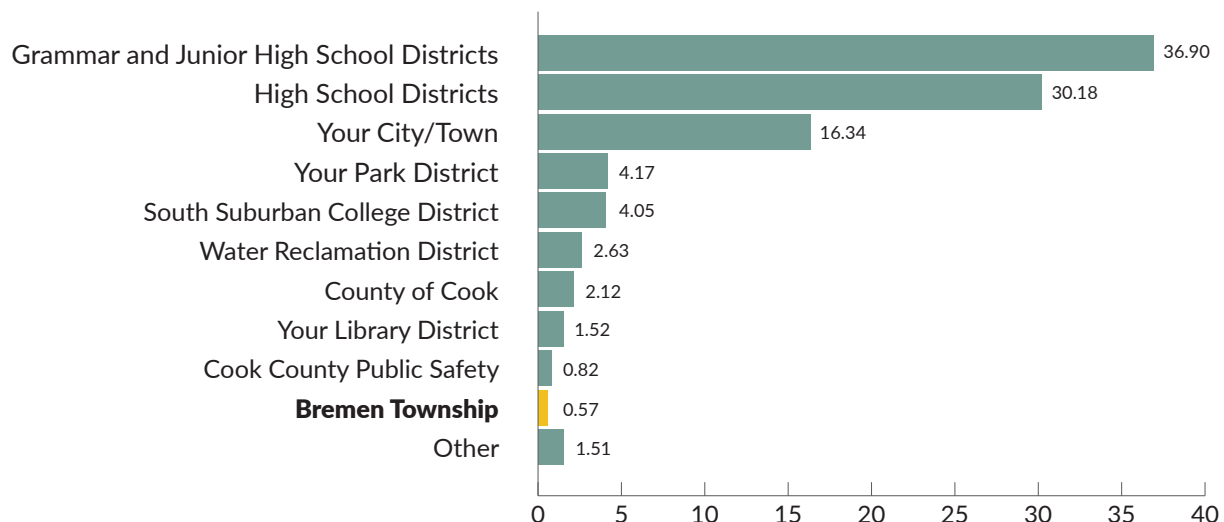


WHERE DO MY TAX DOLLARS GO?

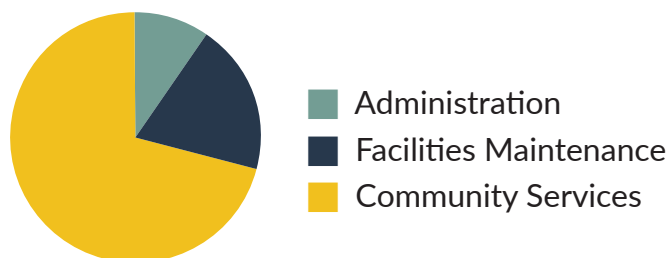
This is intended to serve as a guide for homeowners and your city/town/village/Park District/Library percentages may vary. **The one constant is that Bremen Township receives the lowest amount of revenue.**

The typical Bremen Township homeowner pays approximately \$7,500.00 in property taxes. The illustration below shows the average amount paid to each taxing body, clearly confirming that Bremen Township Government is one of your greatest values.

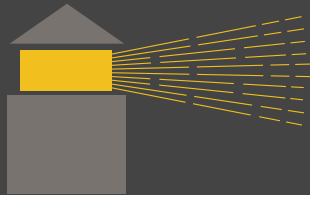

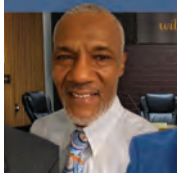

VILLAGE OF ROBBINS

Renewal in Robbins: A Beacon of Change



At the north end of Bremen Township lies the historic Village of Robbins, a community of great pride once overlooked and is now on the cusp of a remarkable transformation. Spearheading this revitalization is Mayor Darren E. Bryant, the youngest minority mayor in the State of Illinois, whose visionary leadership has ignited a fervent drive for progress. Mayor Bryant has led a united front with the collaboration of Clerk Sharon Dyson, the Board of Trustees, and the resilient people of Robbins uniting behind a shared vision of renewal. Together, they've embarked on a journey to breathe new life into their community.

Since taking office in 2021, Mayor Bryant has orchestrated an unprecedented influx of \$40 million in grant funding for capital improvements, laying the groundwork for sweeping changes across the village. The historic Village Hall, once a symbol of neglect, is now undergoing a \$1million renovation, poised to emerge as a beacon of civic pride and community engagement. Concurrently, the \$22 million Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) project is on track to alleviate flooding and catalyze economic and recreational, heralding a new era in the village's future.

Fresh off the heels of these monumental achievements, the village also recently approved a \$3 million commercial development initiative to revive Claire Boulevard and rejuvenate its downtown district. This bold investment signals a renewed sense of optimism and confidence in the village's future.

One of the cornerstones of the Bryant Administration's initiatives has been the ambitious public works clean-up effort. The village which is currently plagued with 160 distressed properties, has seen the demolition of over 40 distressed properties creating opportunity for economic advancement, while decreasing opportunities for crime.

Another significant stride forward has been the introduction of Robbins' own self- service ambulance, ensuring swift responses to emergencies and enhancing the safety of its residents.

As Robbins embraces its identity as a hub of opportunity and innovation, Mayor Bryant's Clerk Dyson, and the Board of Trustees transformative leadership continues to inspire hope and fuel for momentum towards a brighter tomorrow

With the sun setting on the old and rising on the new, Robbins stands as a beacon of hope and resilience – a testament to what can be achieved when a community comes together with determination and a vision.
