During her tenure as Bremen Township Supervisor, Maggie was instrumental in establishing and expanding programs and services for residents of Bremen Township. She also ensured that each and every community had the same opportunity and access to services were available to anyone that needed assistance.

The financial policies and practices that she implemented resulted in our township being awarded the highest possible rating from independent financial institutions. Her unwavering belief that all elected officials are obligated to serve as advocates for taxpayers, was her guide throughout her career, and that we were here to serve the residents and not ourselves. This resolute approach led Bremen Township to be one of the few government entities to be debt free.
